The position seeks to attract established scholars specializing in Asian studies, international relations, political theory, comparative politics, security studies, normative political economy, environmental humanities and related fields. Applicants will have demonstrated track record of generating innovative, cross-disciplinary research into the history, justification, and impact of Asian normative orders and comparing the ways in which they confront, compliment, and transform established traditions, norms, and institutions. At the same time, selected candidates will possess sufficient breadth of specialist knowledge to be able to conduct research tracking the evolution of Asian (and global) norms through periods of discontinuous change marked not only by 'the rise of Asia', but also by the radical reality of simultaneous environmental, economic, political, and societal changes.

The Institute of Social Justice offers a stimulating, demanding, and dynamic disciplinary and interdisciplinary research environment. The research of the current members of the Institute engages with social and political theory and practice from East Africa to East Asia.

POSITION PURPOSE

The Senior Research Fellow will have experience in research and scholarly activities which have resulted in publications in high-quality refereed journals and/or secured competitive research funding. They will be expected to carry out independent research, to contribute to collaborative research and supervise, mentor and train postgraduate research students. Overall, this position will contribute to and enhance the research profile of the ACU Institute of Social Justice.

As the Senior Research Fellow in Non-Western Political Thought, you will have an interest in re-thinking Western-oriented methods of inquiry and theories, which in turn allows us to rethink dominant conceptions of knowledge and normativity in political thought. In particular, you will be interested in non-Western conceptions of just, sustainable, and equitable global life and the governance practices that they inform, and in comparing the ways in which such normative understandings confront, complement, and transform established traditions and practices of inquiry.

POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

You will be expected to contribute actively and collaboratively to the strategic direction of the Institute through the development of relevant and meaningful research programs and initiatives drawing on non-Western approaches to the fragile and unpredictable conditions of global life. You will also show an interest in combining original normative reflection with diverse forms of action research and contribute to the Institute's Doctoral Program in Social and Political Thought through postgraduate teaching and the supervision of doctoral students.

Successful candidates will possess:

- Expertise in postcolonial, subaltern, gender/feminist, queer and other critical approaches to non-Western political thought;
- Sophisticated knowledge of non-Western conceptions of justice and ethical life;
- Demonstrated familiarity with the manner in which the 'political' is conceived in non-Western contexts, and critical engagement with non-Western modes of political action.
- Demonstrated capacity to seek and secure funding from external bodies.

SKILLS, KNOWLEDGE AND EXPERIENCE (Selection Criteria)

Essential

- 1. Possession of a PhD in a relevant discipline.
- 2. Demonstrated familiarity with Non-Western, post-colonial, feminist, and/or critical approaches to political thought.
- 3. Demonstrated planning and organisational skills, with the ability to manage a number of events/projects at one time, achieve required outcomes, and meet deadlines in a high pressure environment.
- 4. The experience and vision to foster new initiatives and partnerships.
- 5. Commitment to teamwork and interdisciplinary research collaboration.
- 6. Distinguished record of research and scholarship.
- 7. Applicants should demonstrate awareness of the University's Mission and Catholic ethos and demonstrate an understanding of how this role serves the Mission.
- 8. Applicants should demonstrate commitment to cultural diversity and ethical practice principles, and demonstrate knowledge of equal employment opportunity and workplace health and safety, appropriate to the level of the appointment.
